PhilHealth IDs and MDRs are for free!

Members in need of these can request for one at any PhilHealth office, especially those who are getting it for the first time. PhilHealth maintains branches and service desks to help unsuspecting members evade being tricked into paying for these membership documents.

In addition, PhilHealth has recently introduced its Member Portal. This facility allows members easy access to their records, including their contributions. Members can readily download and print their MDRs – free of travel, hassle, and payment – through the Member Portal. Registration is now possible through this link: https://memberinquiry.philhealth.gov.ph/member/

Now that the Universal Health Care is in place, everyone is immediately entitled to social health insurance benefits offered by PhilHealth. The Corporation calls on every Filipino to protect their PhilHealth membership by not pursuing dubious transactions offered by questionable characters.
